In the meantime, I look forward to what lies ahead! I look forward to:


- ❖ Preparing sermons and sharing my insights into God's word with you from the pulpit;


2017 – 2018 Report of the Hospitality Committee


2017-2018 Report of the Future's Committee


2017-2018 Report of the Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees has continued its stewardship of the church building, parsonage, and combined grounds of Oak Lawn Community Baptist Church. The Board maintains and repairs the inside and outside of our property. It also handles the church finances and invested funds. Projects undertaken by the Board of Trustees during the 2017-2018 are as follows:

- Replacement of soap dispenser in Ladies Room.
- Painting of parking lot markings and top step of Quaker Room entrance.
- Maintenance and repair of the church alarm system.
- Lawnmower maintenance and repair as well as lawn mowing.
- Repair of the parsonage washing machine and broken attic window.
- Expanded church insurance to cover use of neighboring Buco and Buco back parking lot for church guests.
- Quotes are being collected for professional repairs needed at the church and parsonage as well as the painting of both buildings.
- Naturally Clean continues to clean the church,
- Change of electricity supplier from National Grid to North American Power.
- Tree cutting and cleanup after damage from several storms.
- Insulation of restroom pipes as mandated by the insurance company.
- Arranging for contracted snow plowing.
- Allowing court ordered community service to be done with church supervision.
- US Census Bureau used church space for several training sessions.
- Requests for use of church space were approved by the Trustees.
- Fall and spring cleanups as well as window washing were accomplished.

The Board of Trustees appreciates the support of the church congregation. Those who donate time and talents help the Trustees to maintain the Oak Lawn Community Baptist Church buildings and property.
